Emergency Broadband Benefit Program – Apply for discounts on broadband service and equipment

Help with evictions

Allegheny County Housing Authority – Find which public housing communities in Allegheny County have openings

HUD Affordable Apartment Search – Search by area and the number of bedrooms you need.

HUD Low-rent Apartment Search – Find apartments based on household income.

Go Section 8 – People with or without a Section 8 voucher can search for apartments.

AffordableHousingOnline – See Section 8 wait lists Allegheny County.

Affordable Search – Search for homes by neighborhood.

PAHousing Search – Allows you to search by neighborhood in Allegheny County and beyond.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program – Benefits eligible Pennsylvanians aged 65 and older; widows and widowers aged 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older.

If you need help with housing stabilization and preventing your eviction start with the Allegheny Housing Stabilization Collaborative, led by ACTION-Housing. There is in person assistance available at the Housing Stabilization Center, Monday through Friday 9:30 am to 4:30 pm located at 415 7th Avenue (Downtown) Pittsburgh, PA 15222

If there is a threat of eviction, but no legal action, call or text [RentHelpPGH](#) at 412-534-6660 (English) or 412-530-5244 (Spanish).

If there is a threat of eviction, and you've received notice of a pre-filing, contact [Just Mediation Pittsburgh](#) at 412-228-0730; please note that this program requires the participation of your landlord.

If there has been an eviction action filed, contact [Neighborhood Legal Services](#) at 412-255-6700.
